Philosophy, art, cinema, economics, design... Regards (Viewpoints) is a collection of extracts from books, interviews, photo-reportages, as a source of inspiration.

Designer and builder, the architect above all plays an important role in society. If he cannot work without an enlightened client, a dedicated team and competent workers, he remains the protector of the quality of towns and the last line of defence against all that threatens their beauty. This undertaking is more than ever that of *L'Architecture d'Aujourd'hui* where, rather than just expressing outrage, we exalt constructive vision, sound re ection and salutary architecture.
